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The Mutcracker

ACT 1

Scene I: The Stahlbaum Home

It is Christmas Eve. Mayor Stahlbaum, his wife, and children, Clara and Fritz are having a party. The festivities begin. Presents are given out to the children. Suddenly, a mysterious figure enters the room. It is Drosselmeyer, a local magician, and Clara's uncle. He is also a talented toymaker who has brought with him gifts for the children, including 2 lifelike dolls who dance to the delight of all. He then has them put away for safekeeping. Clara and Fritz are sad to see the dolls being taken away, but Drosselmeyer has the toys for them: a wooden Nutcracker for Clara, and a cannon for Fritz. Clara immediately loves her Nutcracker. Fritz, however, is jealous and breaks it. Clara is heartbroken. Soon afterwards, the party is over and Clara must go to bed.

Scene II: The Battle Scene

During the night, Clara returns to the parlor to check on her beloved Nutcracker. Clara curls up and falls asleep holding her Nutcracker. Drosselmeyer appears and begins to cast a magic spell on Clara. Suddenly, mice and toys begin to fill the room and the Christmas tree begins to grow to dizzying heights. The Nutcracker also grows to life-size. Clara finds herself in the midst of a battle between an army of soldiers, stuffed animals and mice, led by the Rat King. As the Rat King advances on the Nutcracker, Clara throws her shoe at him distracting him long enough for the Nutcracker to stab him.

Scene III: The Snow Kingdom

The Nutcracker turns into a Prince, and along with unicorns he transports Clara from her parlor to a magical Snow Kingdom ruled by the Snow Queen and King and the Winter Snows who have been brought to life by the magic of Christmas.

ACT II


Scene IV: The Kingdom of the Sweets

The unicorns guide Clara and the Nutcracker Prince to the Kingdom of the Sweets, which is ruled by the Sugar Plum Fairy and her Cavalier. Clara recounts the story of the heroic Nutcracker Prince. With gratitude for saving the Nutcracker Prince, the Sugar Plum Fairy presents a celebration of Sweets from around the world. Chocolate from Spain, Coffee from Arabia, and Tea from China all dance for their amusement; Candy Canes from Russia; Danish Marzipan Cupcakes and Mother Ginger with her children, the Gingerbread Cookies, perform; and a string of beautiful flowers dance a waltz. To conclude the night, the Sugar Plum Fairy and her Cavalier perform a dance. A final waltz is performed by all the Sweets, after which Clara is crowned ruler of the Kingdom of Sweets. Soon, they leave with everyone waving goodbye. Clara is found sleeping in the parlor. The Nutcracker is under her arms. She awakes, thinking it was all a dream, but then finds her crown sitting beside her, leading to the question, was it a dream?

DYLAN SANTOS
Dylan Santos is originally
from Bahia Brazil and
grew up in the state of Sao
Paulo, Brazil. He started
dancing at the age of 11
at the school Municipal
de Bailados de São Paulo.

At the age of 12, he began his professional Ballet training at Centro de Artes Pavilhão D, under the direction of Ricardo Schier, At 16. he was a finalist in the Youth American Grand Prix where he was granted multiple scholarships to study ballet in the United States, Germany and Canada. He also started his international training at The Harid Conservatory, and shortly after was invited to join Houston Ballet's professional program under the direction of Claudio Munoz and Stanton Welch, where he was able to perform with the main company. At 19, Mr. Santos landed his first job with Orlando Ballet under the direction of Robert Hill. He also was a company member with Columbia City Ballet (South Carolina) State Street Ballet (Santa Barbara), and had collaborations and guest performances with the Joffrey Ballet, Houston Ballet, Ballet Chicago and Ballet Opera de Paris.


Currently, Mr. Santos is a lead dancer with the Dance Theatre of Harlem and he is starting his ninth season with the company. In 2019, he was invited by the director, Virginia Johnson, to re-stage a classical ballet for the company. The work premiered at the (IABD) International Association of Blacks in Dance and is currently part of the 2021/2022 tour season for the company. Mr. Santos also choreographed many other works as his focus on the next steps of his career as choreographer and producer.

Mr. Santos believes that art is for everyone and visibility and representation are very important for change. "I wish for all the new generation of dancers to find who they are as an artist and not compare themselves with anyone else."

She is currently the co-chairwoman of the School of American Ballet's Visiting Faculty program.


JILL LANDRITH Artistic Director Metropolitan Ballet Inc.

Jill Landrith has been teaching dance since 1978 and is the owner of the Jill Landrith School of Dance.

She is currently on faculty in Wichita State University's Dance Department lecturing in Dance History. Jill is the Artistic Director of Metropolitan Ballet, Inc. after being the Artistic Director of Metropolitan Ballet of Wichita (now known as Ballet Wichita) for twenty years, after being Associate Artistic Director for five years. She created an innovative introduction to dance and the arts open to all children five to ten years of age for Unified School District 265 in Goddard, Kansas, and directed that program for nine years.

Jill was a soloist with the Aachen Ballet in West Germany and a member of Ballet Met of Columbus, Ohio. While she was still in Germany, Jill appeared as a Guest Artist with noted choreographer Robert Wexler, and had many roles created on her by Thorsten Muller. It is her goal to make similar opportunities available for her students now. Jill's dance training includes extensive work with David Howard, Maggie Black, Rebecca Wright and Francoise Martinet in New York City, and Bill Martin-Viscount in Texas. Jill began her studies in dance with her mother, June Landrith.

Jill Landrith was featured in an article in the October 2004 issue of Dancer magazine. Recently, she was a guest teacher for the Washington Ballet School, and has also been a guest teacher for The Springfield Ballet, as well as for schools in New Jersey, Florida, and throughout Kansas.

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
